Vegetable Varieties Recommended by Larry Stebbins

The names and contact information of the seed companies and nurseries referenced in this list are given in a companion document. They appear in this list in abbreviated form; e.g. Territorial Seed Co. is "Territorial".

I personally prefer to purchase mostly Open Pollinated, (OP), varieties so that I can save seeds for planting future crops. Additionally, whenever I can get OP *organically grown* seeds, I almost always opt to order them.

I also indicate here in Larry's list whether Steve Solomon, the author of Gardening When It Counts: Growing Food in Hard Times, considers the vegetable easy to grow, (E), harder to grow, (H), or difficult to grow, (D). Some of the ones Steve considers "difficult" are bulbing onions, leeks, Chinese cabbage, celery, celeriac and asparagus. Around here though, I've heard that corn is challenging and sweet potatoes and some varieties of cow peas are difficult because they require warm nights.
